What do Kashmir, Kurdistan, and Northern Ireland share with Israel/Palestine? What major portions of the world will experience the greatest change during your lifetime and why? These and many other questions are tackled to help you judge for yourself the world's marvelous variety, and the problems and possibilities in many places and to anticipate what is likely to happen next.
