How are human rights, wellbeing, and environmental health linked to twentyfirst century extractivism in Latin America? How are concerns over economic growth and environmental protection negotiated, by whom, and with what outcomes?

This seminar-style course examines these questions through a close analysis of the twenty-first century political ecology of environmental degradation, self-determination and resource extraction in Latin America. We will focus on selected South American case studies to examine questions related to environmental justice, indigenous knowledges, and social movements.
